

Many of us had a breakfast snack and Doug Rogers' family member Dale joined us with his family member.

After the stop, we headed north in the right lane on a now congested Highway 167, took the Highway 405 North exit, moved to the speed lane and headed North. As usual, traffic was heavy through Bellevue and then lightened up as we passed the Bothell exit. We stayed in the speed lane past Bothell and continued to the Lynnwood area where we rejoined Highway I-5 North. We moved into the speed lane once again and headed past Everett, over the Snohomish River, then past Marysville. We took the Arlington exit and headed west one block to a Union 76 truck stop. Fortunately, this truck stop had a large parking lot with room for 11 Corvettes in a place out of the way of the 18 wheelers that poured in and out of the place during our stay.



After this break we headed east on Highway 530, passing through Arlington and heading for Darrington. Along the way, we had to stop and wait for our turn to drive the one-way road through the Oso slide zone where 43 people recently lost their lives.



As you can see from the pictures, the slide area was surreal looking in places like the surface of the moon.

Lunch was good and we enjoyed the outdoor dining.



After lunch, we commenced to take on the North Cascade Highway, driving into the mountains. Traffic was moderate and there were sufficient passing areas that we made good time. Better yet, traffic was pretty much non-existent on the stretch of the highway with the best curves. What fun!



We stopped at the rest area at Washington Pass and enjoyed the good weather. Many of us walked the short trail to the lookout, always breathtaking with the 2000 foot drop just on the other side of the fence.

After this break, we headed east to Winthrop, then South to Twisp where we took our last break at the town's Chevron station.

We left Twisp at about 4:00 pm, and just out of town reached the Twisp Carlton Road, a detour around the recent washout on Highway 153. We turned onto the Twisp Carlton Road and headed south, traveling through mile after mile of fire ravaged landscapes from the huge wildfire this summer in the Carlton area.



The detour was made necessary because of a freak thunder storm, which just a few weeks ago, dumped over an inch of rain in one hour on this fire damaged land. The resulting rushing water washed out Highway 153, our planned route from Twisp to Lake Pateros



After reaching the end of the detour, we continued down Highway 153 to Lake Pateros, witnessing fire damage all along the way.
