


We drove 20-25 minutes of beautiful Cow Canyon desert mountain land, and then reach our first break.

We left just after 8:30 and headed west on US 101, then north toward Shelton.




Soon we reached Hood Canal and our first break at the Hoodsport IGA and public restrooms.

Then we drove north along Hood Canal and through the corner of the Olympic National Park to Cuilcene






We had a pleasant break at the Twana Road House and then continued on our journey.
